This is a brief reminder to continue to promote the **Care and Share Catholic Appeal**. It is important to do so.

Four same-sex couples filed a suit against the State of Montana on Wednesday, May 21<sup>st</sup> challenging Constitutional Initiative 96, passed by a 2/3 majority in 2004. The Initiative states that “Only a marriage between one man and one woman shall be valid or recognized as a marriage in this state” (Mont. Consti. Art. XIII, § 7). Though I have not made a public statement on this particular challenge as yet, I have written on the issue of “same-sex marriage” a number of times over the years. There obviously are changing attitudes among many people throughout the US regarding the nature of marriage. Notwithstanding this cultural change nor what a particular judge may say about the definition of marriage, it cannot change what marriage actually is. This is not just a religious statement but one from natural law.

Earlier this week, the schedule for confirmations and first communions were completed. It is wonderful to know that there are so many young people to have received these sacraments and know the spiritual support of their parishes.

There are obviously a number of graduations coming up. Remember to pray for the graduating seniors!

Darren Eultgen is continuing to facilitate listening sessions in parishes in the Diocese. There is one scheduled for St. Anthony’s in Laurel this weekend. He just completed one for Forsyth and Hysham earlier this week.

I will be at a Catholic Rural Life meeting in St. Paul, MN on June 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>.

A particularly special event for the Diocese coming soon is the ordination of 9 men as permanent deacons. This will be at St. Patrick's Co-Cathedral on Saturday morning, June 7th at 11:00 AM.
