We emphasize the inalienable dignity of each human person, including their spiritual dimension. Catholic education is not merely an instrument for the acquisition of information and skills. Catholic Education seeks the development of the whole person, created in the image and likeness of God. Catholic education is intentionally directed to the growth of the whole person. An integral education seeks to help each student develop intellectually, physically, psychologically, morally, and religiously.
